Dear Secretary Bose:

On July 5, 2007, the Commission initiated the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Pre-Filing review process for Dominion Transmission, Inc.'s (DTI) Storage Factory Project. The Storage Factory Project is designed to develop natural gas storage capability by leaching caverns within existing embedded salt formations located in Tioga County, Pennsylvania. These caverns will be integrated with DTI's existing storage and transportation assets, and will provide additional capabilities to meet increased gas market demand in the eastern United States.

Along with the new salt storage caverns, DTI plans to construct additional facilities in conjunction with its depleted-reservoir storage facilities, and certain pipeline and natural gas compression facilities in order to receive and deliver gas on behalf of the Storage Factory Project customers.

DTI has determined that additional time is required to finalize its plans for leaching salt caverns, and for disposition of brine from the salt cavern development. In the meanwhile, DTI plans to develop an alternative project scope to ensure that the Storage Factory Project customers receive service within their anticipated time frame. DTI will configure the salt cavern aspects of its project to meet future needs.

To that end, DTI requests that the Commission terminate its Pre-Filing review process for the Storage Factory Project at this time. In a few years, DTI will file a revised project scope, designed to serve the initial customers of its Storage Factory Project. DTI anticipates that this revised project will include natural gas facilities in Frederick County, Maryland, along with gas transmission and storage facilities in other locations on the DTI system that will be necessary to provide service to its customers in Maryland and the Mid-Atlantic Region. In development of its revised project, DTI will take into consideration the significant input that it has received from stakeholders that have participated in this docket.
